# Safe Use of Plate Compactor

# What Happened?

The IP was attempting to start a Wacker plate compactor when he pulled the cord which did not fully deploy, causing a dislocation to the tip of his right ring finger. The Operative was experienced in the use of this type of plant.

## Root Causes:

- The IP did not undertake a dummy pull to get the machine turning over before exerting maximum force and failed to grasp the starter toggle in a manner which provided a secure grip.
- The IP was not aware of the risk associated with the starter cord/toggle during the operation due to the number of 'safe starts' they had previously experienced.

## **Considerations:**

All sites are reminded to consider the following:

- > Ensure that a task specific risk assessment is in place and relevant
- > Ensure that plant inspection regime is place
- > Record and communicate procedures through regular briefings and refresher training
- > Consider replacing the corded starter mechanism on compactors with an electric push button
- Don't rush the operation
- Speak to your Supervisor or raise an observation / near miss if you have any concerns



Do not grip the toggle like this!



**3. Grip the toggle between** the fingers at the 1<sup>st</sup> knuckle.

- 1. Open the throttle by moving the lever downward.
- 2. To lubricate the engine, slowly pull out the cord to full extension.
- 4. Pull slowly until you feel some resistance.
- 5. Pull the cord briskly in a straight line.
